LET'S FACE IT UPFRONT: "Recruiting " is a form of selling, and some people do not like to sell anything. However, recruiting new members can be painless and can actually be fun – if you prepare properly, practice and develop your recruiting skills. Each District will have recruiter training this year.

Who is responsible for building the membership of your Post? As if the Post Commander doesn't have enough to do, our By-Laws say he is: Section 518 (a) (1) j Commander shall "Assure that eligible veterans are encouraged to join and maintain membership". And while I am going to hold him responsible, all of the members need to share that load, get some skin in the game. Because when the Commander fails to meet that responsibility, we all do, the Post does and so does the Department of NH Veterans of Foreign Wars. That having been said, how do we plan for Membership Recruiting success? We will do it in accordance with these steps:

Select and organize a membership committee.

- Qualities of your Membership Chairman:
 - 0 Well-known, organized, well-spoken, knowledgeable and dedicated.
- Qualities of your committee members:
 - O Active, knowledgeable and dependable

Develop a recruiting plan in five elements.

- Analyze your current situation
 - 0 Where is the Post, using last year's membership as a starting point
- Set Goals
 - Set attainable quotas for new and reinstated members and dates for achieving them
 - O Check our 2018-2019 Membership Plan for incentives in setting your dates
- Develop a Plan of Action
 - Schedule your poppy sales, membership drives at community events, attendance at veteran forums, gun sales or other events where veterans are likely to be present, regularly contact members coming up for renewal or have expired, wear VFW attire and be present in the community.
- Implement your action plan
 - 0 Translate your plans on paper into actions carried out by your recruiting team. See the sample recruiting plan that I have attached for some ideas.
- Track and report your results
 - 0 Each Post will report the results of each months recruiting results to me at the end of each month using the report that I have attached. Thanks to Jorg Dreusicke for his help.

One of our objectives is building our membership with a greater proportion of younger veterans. We are about run out of our WWII veterans and Korean War veterans won't be far behind. The younger veterans have different needs. Our Posts need to put on programs for families to make ourselves more appealing to younger recruits. All qualified veterans are welcome so don't turn your backs on older ones either. Remember the three "Rs" of membership growth: Retain, Reinstate, Recruit.

Our expired lists are filled with comrades that we know – that we once recruited, but for some reason slipped away out our back doors. The Quartermaster in each Post needs to identify these former members and working with the Membership Committee and Post members reach out to them to bring them back into the organization — I know that we can do it. We must do it Membership is still definitely job ONE!

Membership Program All State Team Post Commanders and Post Quartermasters

Every Post Commander and Quartermaster who meets or exceeds the minimum standards by June 30, 2019 will be considered for the title of All State Commander and Quartermaster. Each member of the All-State Post Commander and Quartermaster team will receive an official "All-State Post Commanders and Quartermaster's Cap" with Lapel Pin. (White hats will not be handed out until the Department outing in August 2019).

Minimum Requirements for Judging:

- 1) Posts must be at least 100 % in membership to qualify.
- 2) Each Post must recruit 6 New or Reinstated members; Post must show a total of at least 5% New or Reinstated members.
- 3) Post must report in all Programs.
- 4) Must purchase 3 new life memberships from National Home (\$50.00 each)
- 5) Post must purchase at least 1000 Poppies, or the number purchased in the previous year, whichever is greater
- 6) Post must be in compliance with the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure.
- 7) Must have participated in Voice of Democracy (VOD). For VOD, if you sponsor a student and advance them to District, you receive Five (5) Points or donate \$100.00 to the Department's VOD fund, for a (3) point credit, Any or All will give you credit.
- 8) Post must have participated in Patriots Pen Program. For Patriots Pen, if you sponsor a student and advance them to District, you receive (Five 5) Points or donate \$100.00 to the Departments Patriots Pen fund. For a three (3) Point credit. Any or All will give you credit.
- 9) Must have participated in the National Teachers award, one entry from any category advanced to District, equals (5) Points or donate \$100.00 to the Departments Teachers fund, for a three (3) Point credit. Any or All will give you credit.
- 10) Must make all Department mandatory contributions and non-mandatory by November 15, 2018.
- 11) Posts must be 50 members plus to qualify for All State.
- 12) Post Commanders or (Sr. Vice/Jr Vice), in the case of Commanders absents. Quartermasters, Post Service Officers and at least 1 Trustee MUST attend OTI. All Districts will hold selected OTI material for their District Meeting presented by the Department representative, under the direction of Dana Hussey, OTI Chairman. Points: (5) Commander, (4) Sr. Vice, (3) Jr. Vice, (3) QM, (7) any Trustee

2018 - 2019 Membership Drawings

- 1) All Posts that are the following percentage by the dates indicated will be put in a drawing for the following drawings.

Membership Mission

To recruit, retain, and mentor a stable membership base, including all generations of veterans.

To cultivate a membership that is well versed in institutional knowledge and actively involved at all levels of the organization and in the local community. To establish Posts with a strong tradition of service, leadership, and community outreach.

Introduction

For the past several years, the VFW has been relatively successful in recruiting members aged 39 and younger. The only way to make this success permanent is to retain those members, recover past members, and recruit new members. We must improve the way we communicate with our members at all levels of the organization. Does your Post, District, State or Department have a newsletter, email, or an outreach team that visits fellow members? In many cases, we have lost touch with our members. We need to know who they are and what their needs are. Let us get back to basics—our first priority is taking care of our members and the veteran community as a whole.

Membership Goals

- **1.** Build a strong organization for the future.
- 2. Work together to achieve the VFW's goals. The VFW National Headquarters staff is here to assist in coordinating programs, developing new membership initiatives and building awareness among our membership and the entire veteran community.

Membership Objectives

- Recruit new and recover unpaid members
- Retain and mentor existing membership
- Develop new Posts and revitalize existing Posts
- Increase Life Membership
- Increase Legacy Life Membership

Retention Defined

Although retention is <u>not</u> a prerequisite for the All-American program, it is extremely important to understand how retention is derived and the important role retention plays in accomplishing growth. The number of paid annual members in your Post on July 1 is the ensuing year's "prior year total." One more new or reinstated member is required to make up for each prior year annual member the Post fails to retain.

Your Post retention is derived from six types of payment components based on your prior year total of annual members:

- A prior year annual member pays his or her annual membership dues.
- A prior year annual member pays the life membership installment fee.
- A prior year annual member pays for life membership dues.
- A prior year annual member transfers to another Post and pays his or her annual membership dues.
- A prior year annual member transfers to another Post and pays the life membership installment fee.
- A prior year annual member transfers to another Post and pays life membership dues.

Life Membership Amnesty

All life members who are reported deceased between July 1, 2018 and August 31, 2018, will be removed from the Post rolls and the Post's prior year membership count will be adjusted accordingly.
